Directions

1. Read: *Snowmen at Night* book and *Build a Silly Snowman* poem. Introduce the concept of using your imagination and discuss the power of thinking beyond the obvious and how that means making pictures and ideas in our minds.
2. Discuss: As a class or in small groups, brainstorm other activities a snowman might do at night that were not in the book.
3. Write: Complete the “At night my snowman would...” handout.
4. Art: Glue half of a large paper plate onto blue paper, glue on the nose, and draw the eyes and mouth with a black marker. Put a small amount of white paint onto a small paper plate. Dab a small amount of white paint onto blue paper with Q-tip to make snow.

Materials

Light blue construction paper, glue, Q-tips, small paper plates, large paper plates (cut in half), orange triangles, and black markers.
